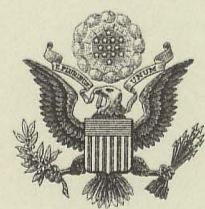


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INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY

TO THE NORTHWESTERNMOST POINT OF THE LAKE OF THE WOODS
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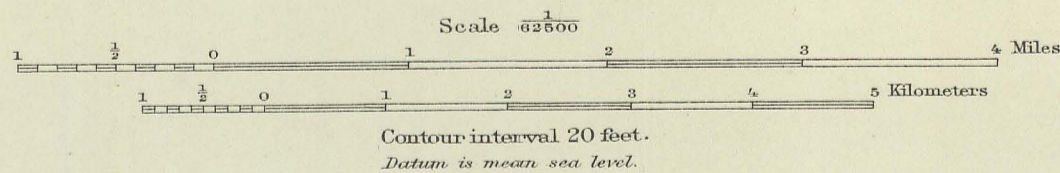
